Things to Consider

Before going abroad you must be aware of the safety implications for your host country and understand how your LGBTQ+ identitity may affect your expeience abroad.

Concepts of identity and the way in which LGBTQ+ individuals are perceived not only vary from country to country but even between regions within the same country. Researching your host country before going abroad will help mitigate risks.

Safety

- What are the general attitudes toward LGBTQ+ people in the host country?
- Will you be staying with a host family who may or may not be accepting of your gender or sexual identity?
- Where can you find LGBTQ+ inclusive medical care in your host country?

Identity

- How open will you be about your sexual orientation and gender identity?
- Are there LGBTQ+ establishments or districts?
- What are the laws regarding LGBTQ+ issues?
- * Keep in mind that you are subject to your host country's laws even if you feel they are discriminatory.

Back in the U.S.

Before returning to the U.S. you must take time to reflect on your experience abroad and evaluate if your relationships back home will be affected. If you chose to come out while abroad, how will that affect your family and friend relationships? Will you have to find a different supportive community?
